WHO ARE VOLUNTEER ON CALL FIREFIGHTERS?

Volunteer on call firefighters are your neighbors, your co-workers and your friends. They are men and women in all walks of life that live close to you and respond whenever paged to deal with the emergencies in our community. They are people who choose to give more than they take from their community.



THE SELECTION PROCESS

Applicants must have:

Commitment: Emergencies happen 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Firefighters are expected to respond to emergency callouts whenever available.

Time: New applicants are required to attend a three day orientation training session. This will be scheduled each spring and fall. Firefighters are required to attend a three hour session every Wednesday evening and to attend regular callouts whenever available. Firefighters are required to attend a minimum of 50% of all training sessions each year. Weekend courses happen throughout the year but are scheduled in advance.

Good Health: Fire fighting is a strenuous job, both mentally and physically. The HLFD conducts an annual fitness test every year for all members.

Clean Criminal Record: Applicants are required to have an RCMP Criminal record search completed during recruit training.

Valid Alberta Drivers License: A minimum class 5 drivers license is required however a class 3 license with an air brake endorsement is preferred. A drivers abstract is also required.
